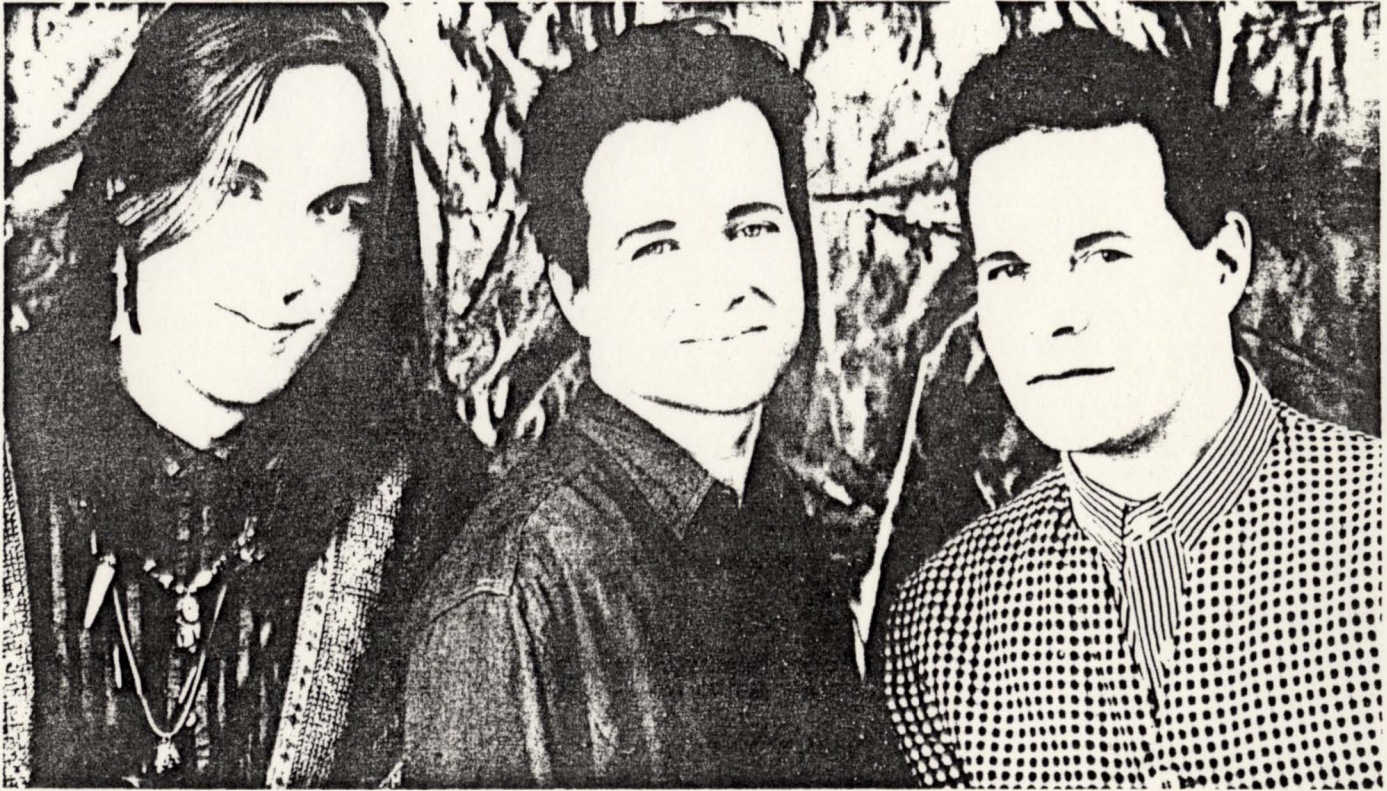

The SGA would like to congratulate the 1990 men's and women's Gamecock Basketball teams.

For the women, 1990 was a record year. The Lady Gamecocks were 25-5 this year, including a 10-1 record at home. In fact, the ladies have an incredible home record, losing only two games at home in the past three years!

The women won second place in the Gulf South Conference and made the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA tournament for the third straight year losing to Delta State in the South Regional finals.

Tracy Linton was the Gulf South Freshman of the year. Dana Bright and Mary Tribble were chosen All-conference. Congratulations to these ladies. A special thank-you goes to Dana, who was selected All-South Region, and this year became JSU's all-time women's leading scorer.

The men also made us very proud this year. The Gamecocks won the Gulf South Conference title for the second straight year. The Gamecocks then went to Lakeland, Florida and won the South Regional Tournament. The men lost in the "elite eight" round, finishing the year at 24-5.
