## Background Information

### Scope and Content Note

This collection (cataloged on Bib #2792679) is comprised of printed copies of speeches and addresses given by Alabamians. The collection was put together by Dr. Alta Millican, Dean of Library Science, Communication and Instructional Media (retired 1986), most probably at the behest of Dr. Ernest Stone, University President at the time, and contains speeches sent to her by Dr. Stone as well as those she collected herself. She labeled them "Important Speeches of Alabamians" and stored them in a vertical file. Dr. Stone referred to them as "Great Speeches by Great Alabamians" and noted in correspondence that the original idea was to laminate or microfilm the speeches in order to make them "available to the public on a restricted basis from now to eternity."
