The JSU Departments of Drama and Music will present a 30th Anniversary performance of **WEST SIDE STORY**, by Leonard Bernstein. The first presentation of this classic musical occurred in 1973 and was the first musical presented as part of the then newly founded Department of Drama, headed by Carlton Ward.

Set in the streets of New York City, two idealistic lovers find themselves caught between warring street gangs, the Jets and the Sharks. Tony and Maria discover each other and it is "love at first sight." However, their respective gangs are totally against their relationship. Their friends' disapproval does little to dissuade them so, against all odds they pursue love, only to face a tradic end.

Wayne H. Claeren is directing this year's anniversary performance. Vocal direction is by Teresa Stricklin. Mark Fifer will conduct the orchestra. Carlton Ward has designed sets. Costumes have been designed by Freddy Clements. Linze McRae is choreographing the extensive dance numbers. And, David Keefer is technical director.

Ron Osborn won 2003's Southern Playwright's Competition with his entry, *WISE WOMEN*. The production, which will be directed by Drama's Susan McCain, begins in 1944. It's almost Christmas. The world is at war, but Florence's daughter, Rose, hardly seems to notice. She's too caught up in the thought that Frank Sinatra is coming to town to sing at the USO.

Florence wants the best for Rose. She wants her to make

something of herself—to meet the "right" people. Enter, two young female boarders who work at the local bomb plant. This is a "bittersweet celebration of womanhood overcoming heart-rending losses and long-standing conflict." It 'also teaches that "family" can be anyone who truly touches our hearts.

Auditions for this production will be held April 7th at 7:00 pm. The director requests a prepared thirtysecond monologue and all are welcome to audition.

Performance dates are May 20, 21, and 22 at 7:00 pm and May 23 at 2:00 pm. Tickets are \$6 for adults; \$5 for JSU personnel and senior citizens; and \$4.00 for students and military.

INTRIGUING "NEW" PLAY TO BE PRODUCED

Claeren to direct "La Veniexiana" JSU Drama's final mainstage production of the 2003-04 season is a highly unusual, surprisingly modern play written about thirty years before Shakespeare was born. Translated by Carolyn Feleppa Balducci, this anonymously written play, *LA VENIEXIANA (The Venetian Way)*, tells the story of lulius (Julius) who has come to Venice in search of a bride. He sets his sights on Valiera, who just happens to be married, but who is eager for a romantic tryst. Adding a twist to the tryst is Anzola, a widow about ten years older that lulius who has her "sights" him. What follows makes us warn you that this is not a play for all ages—as we quote from the Prologue, "Everyone, I ask you, pay attention, and above all, don't be upset if our uninhibited actors flaunt some things in public that we might prefer to pass over in silence."
