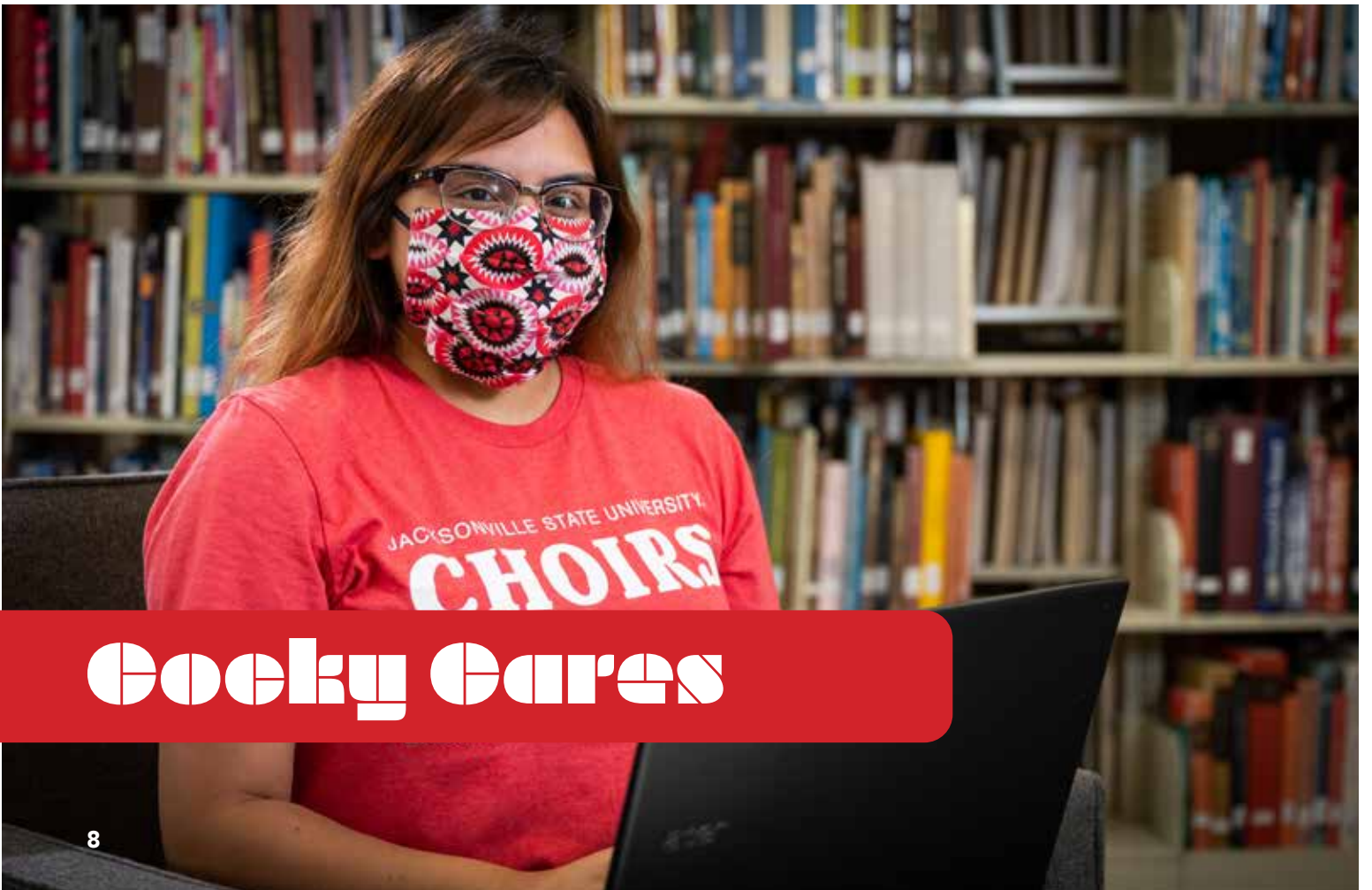
JACKSONVILLE STATE UNIVERSITY

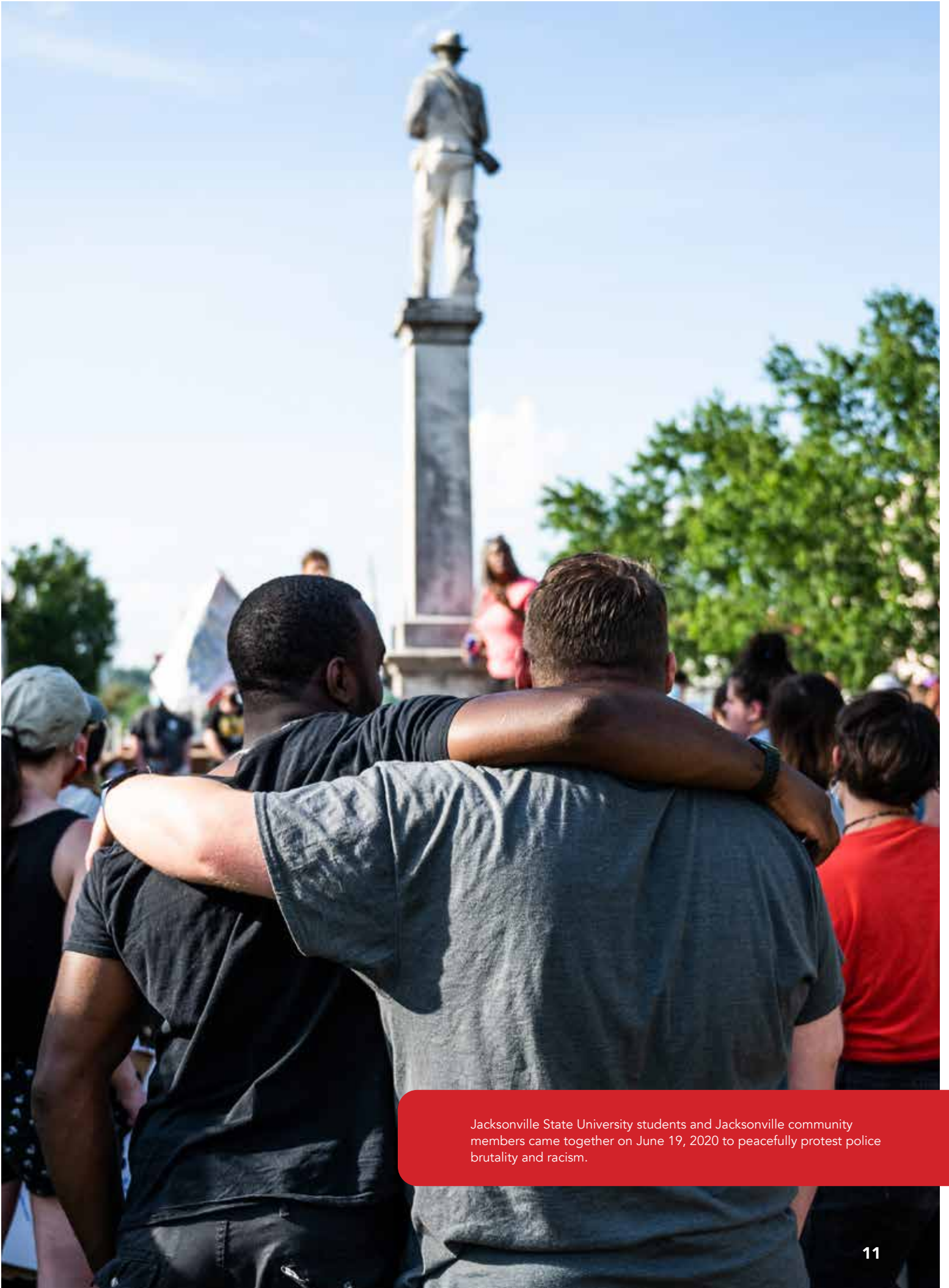


Cocky Cares



As society continued to adjust to COVID-19, JSU created a Cocky Cares campaign to ease anxiety and calm the fears of students returning to campus for Fall 2020. Buildings and classrooms were equipped with protective gear and cleaning supplies, class sizes were reduced and desks spaced, and testing and quarantine protocols were implemented. After a vaccine was developed in early spring, the Department of Public Safety organized vaccine clinics for employees and students. Activities were adjusted as well, with drive-in movies and other outdoor and distanced events offered by the SGA to entertain students.

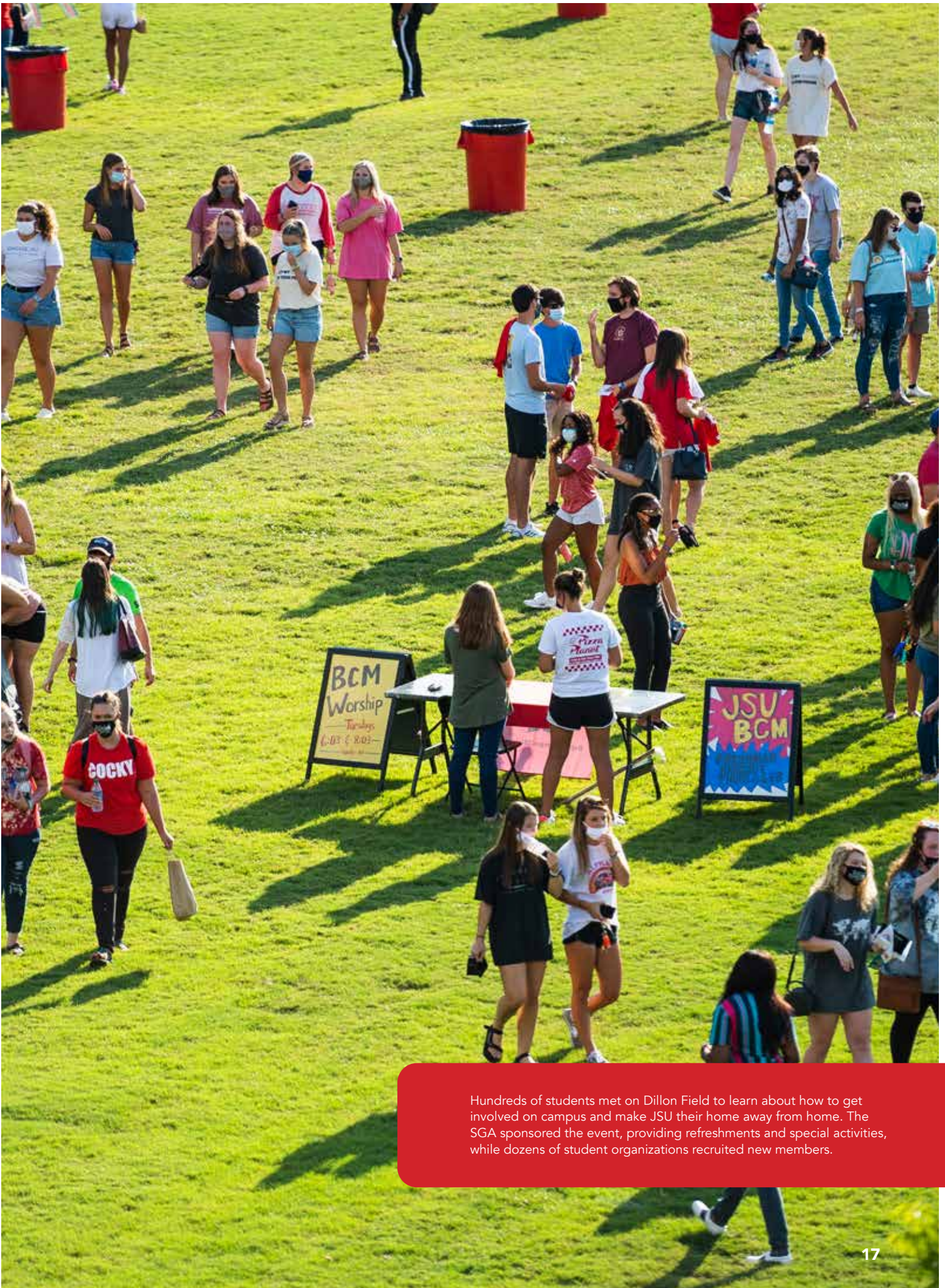
Freshman Convocation

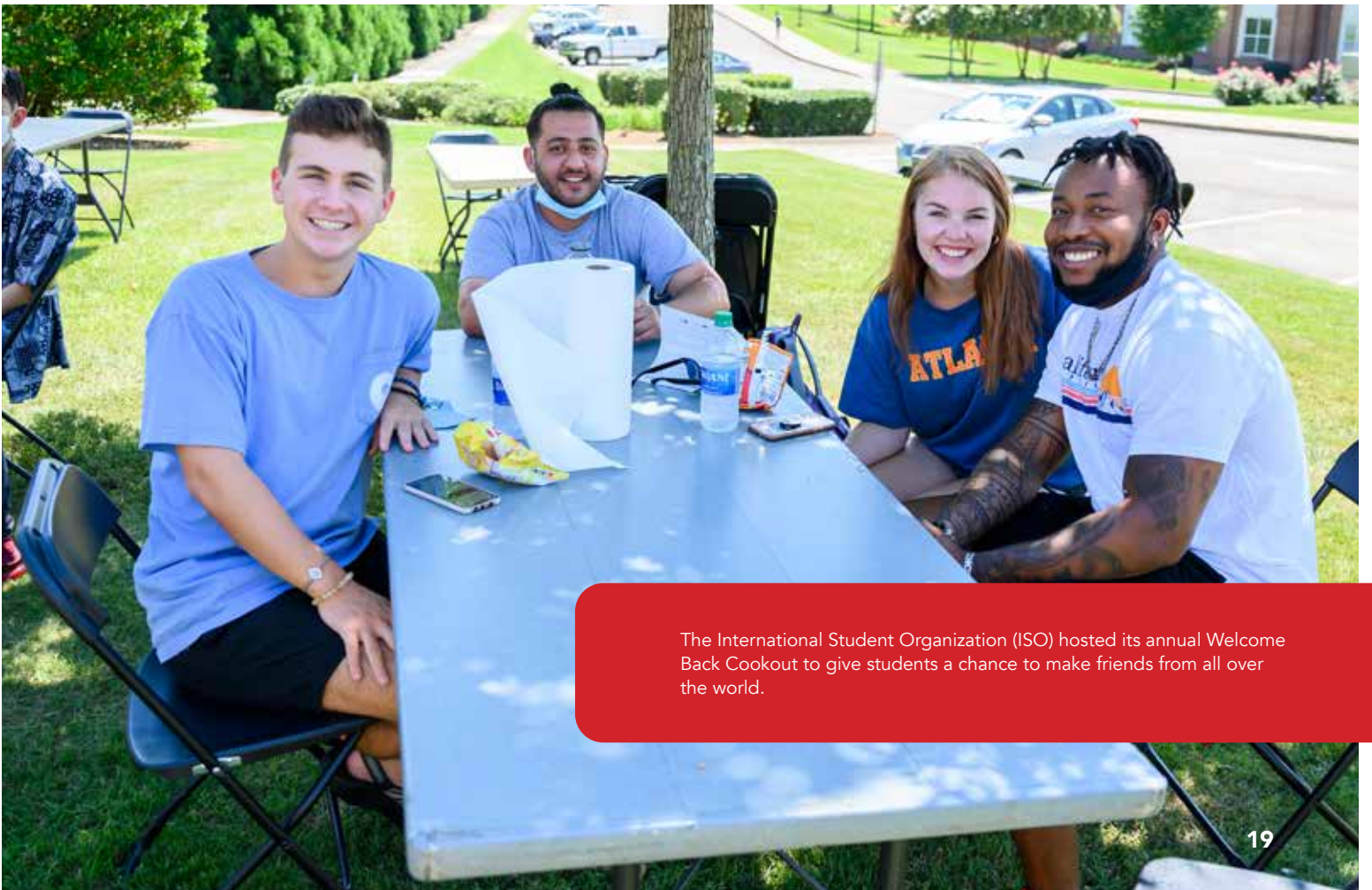
Get on Board Day

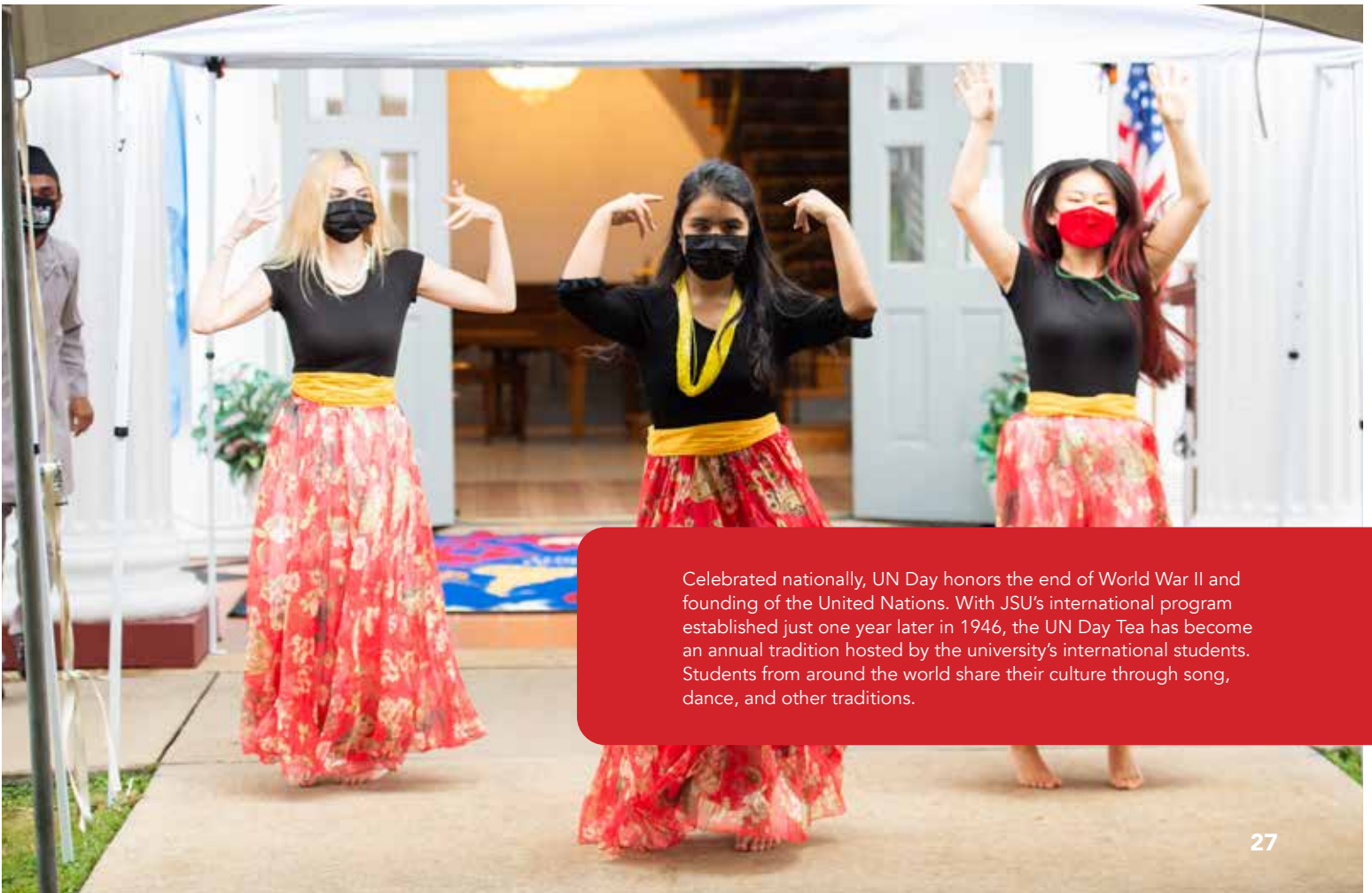

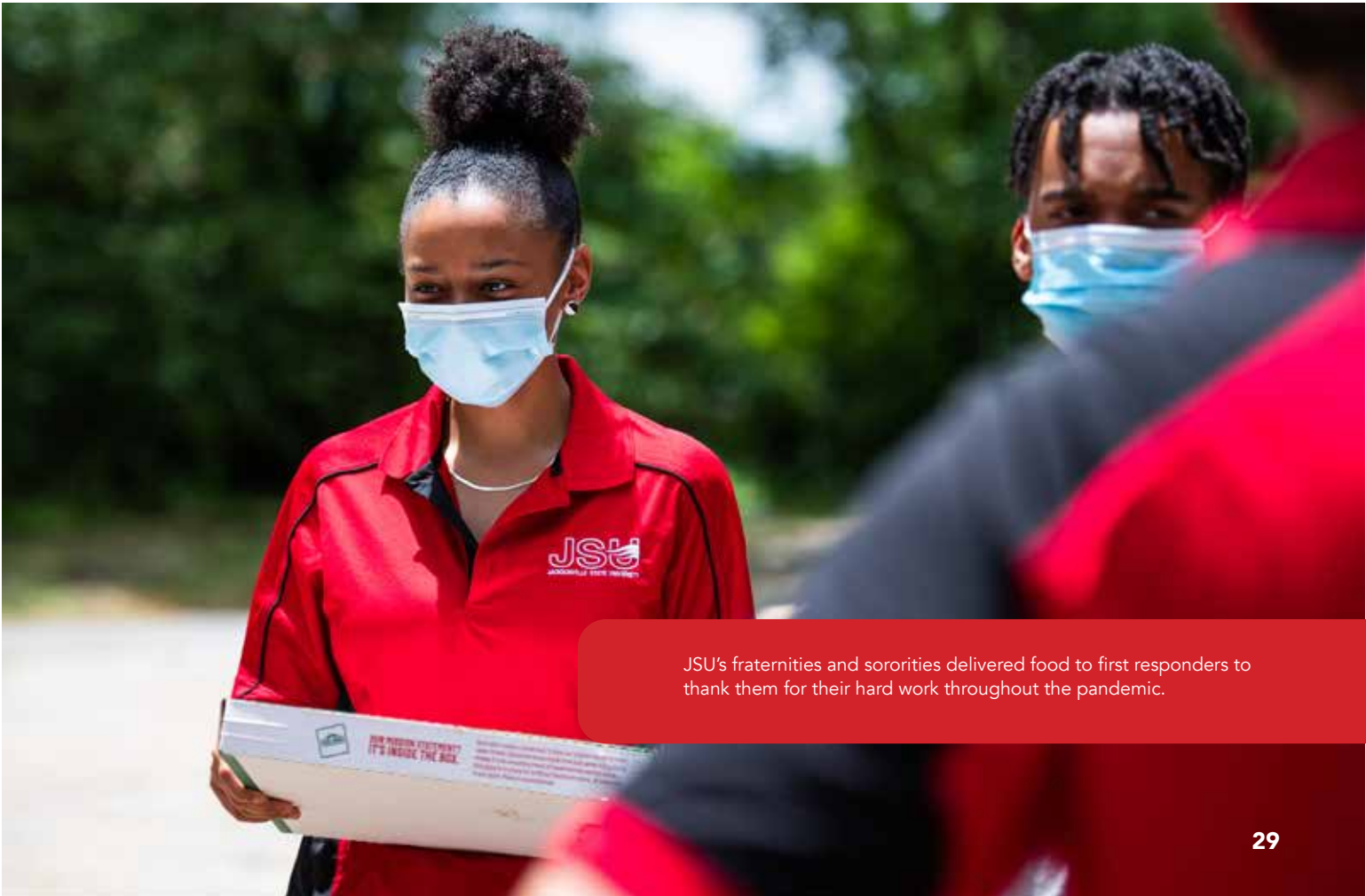
UN Day Tea

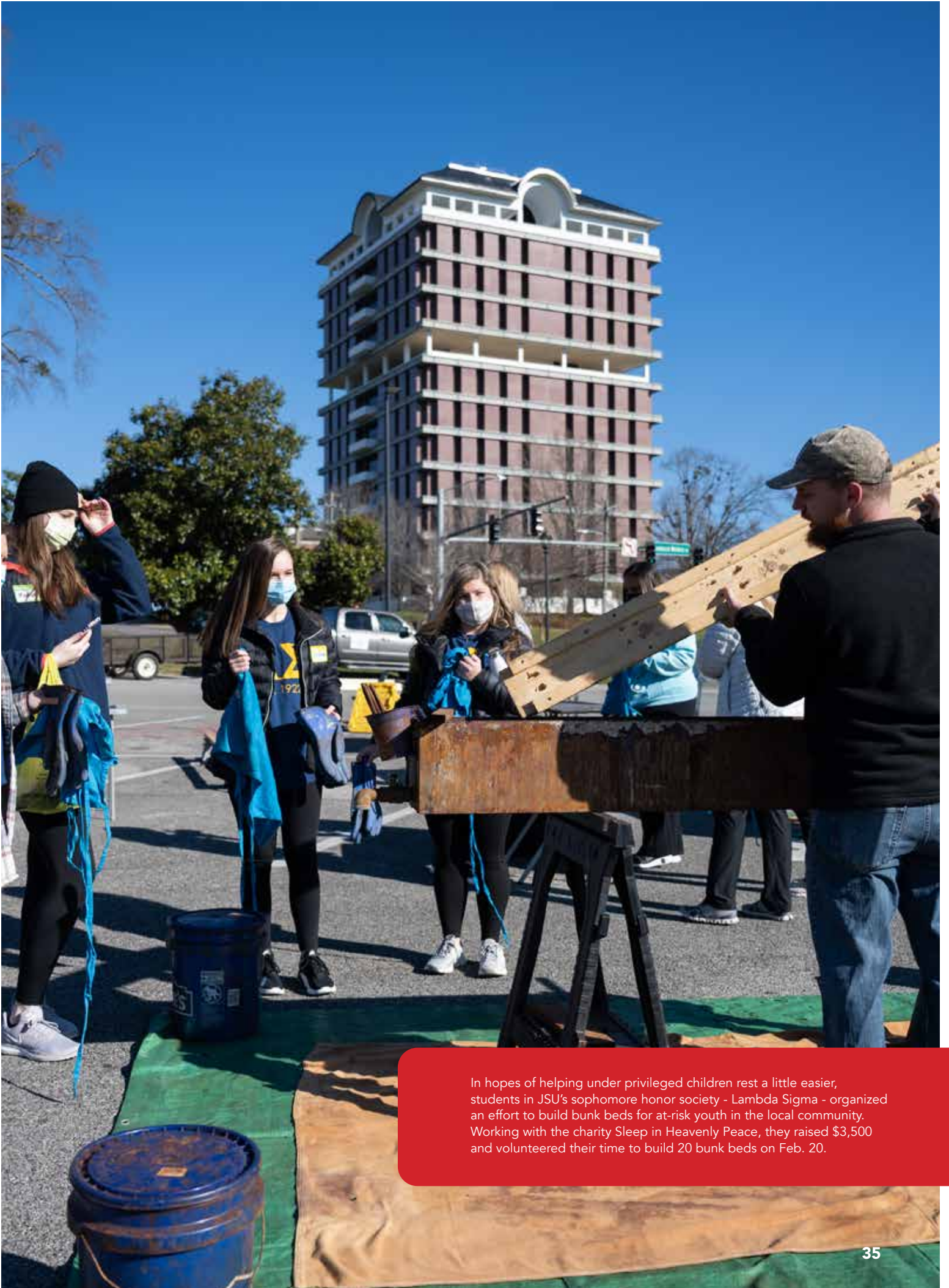




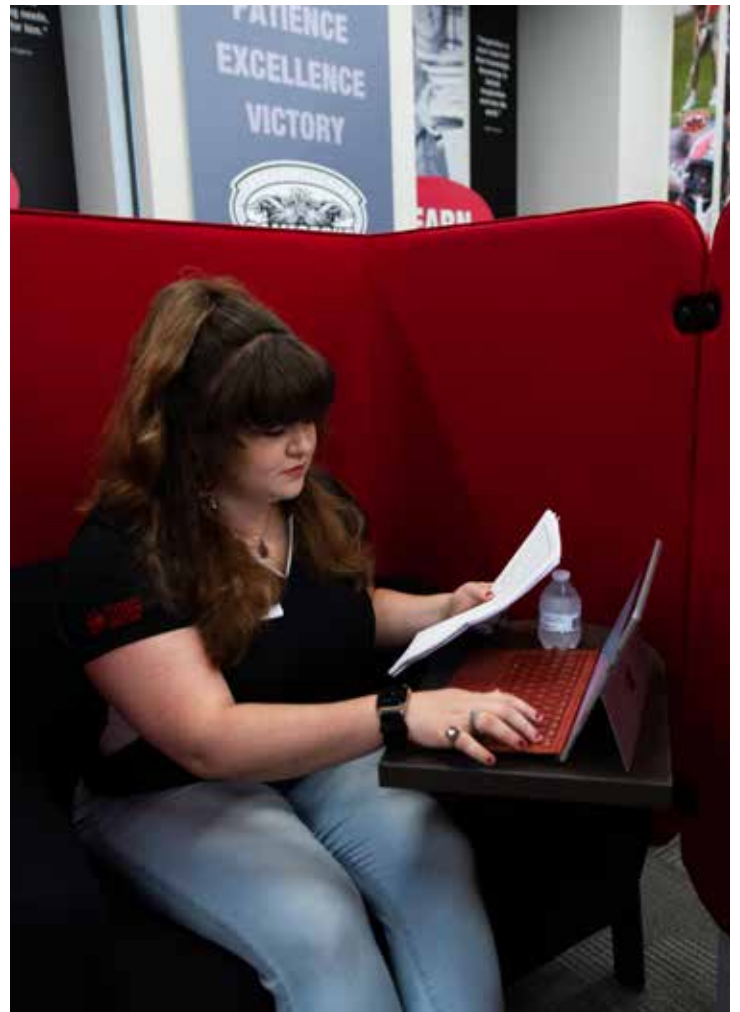
With social distancing protocols interfering with traditional gatherings, the SGA found creative ways to safely keep students involved and entertained, such as SGA Paint Night.

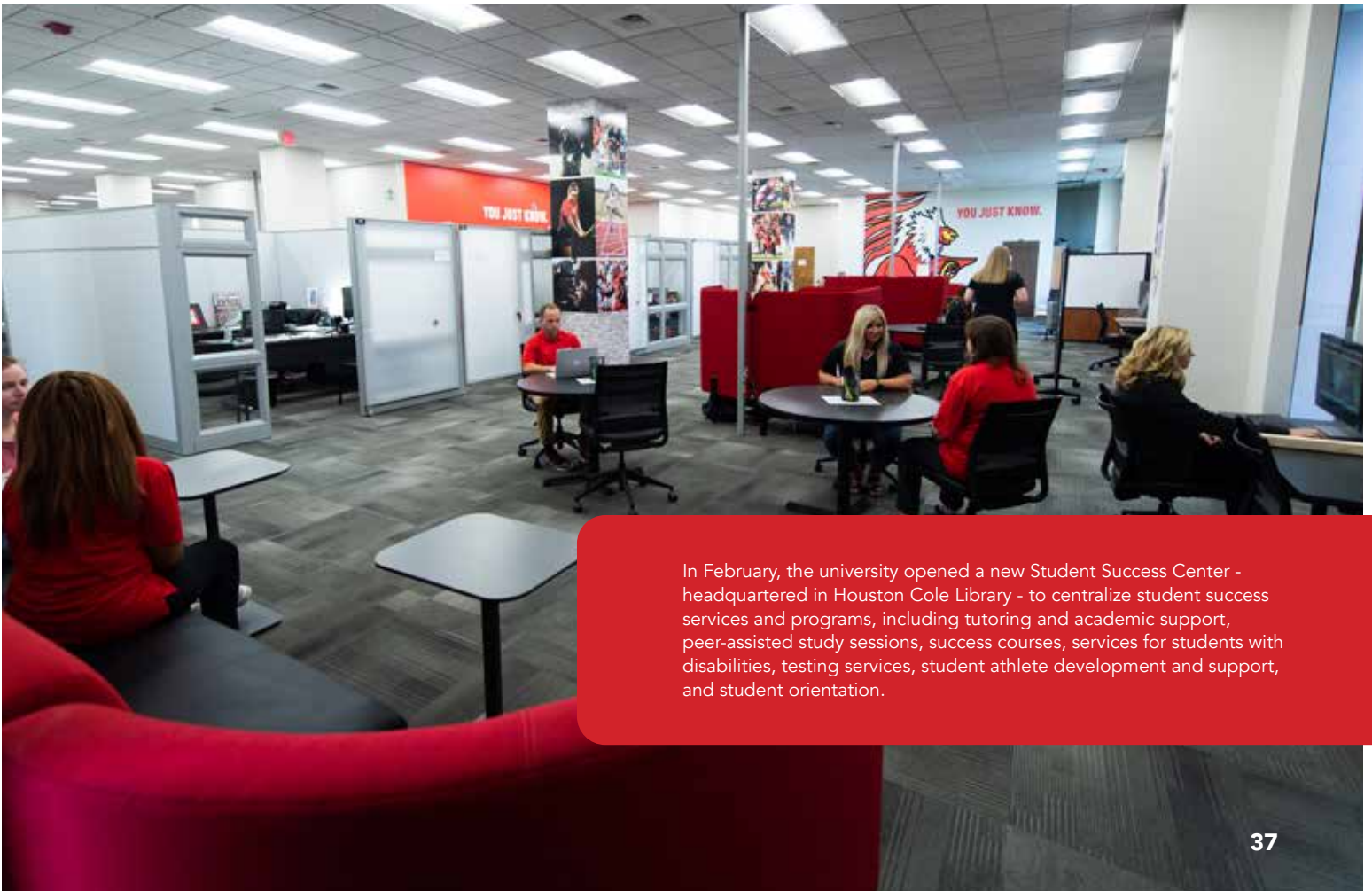


Bed Building Drive

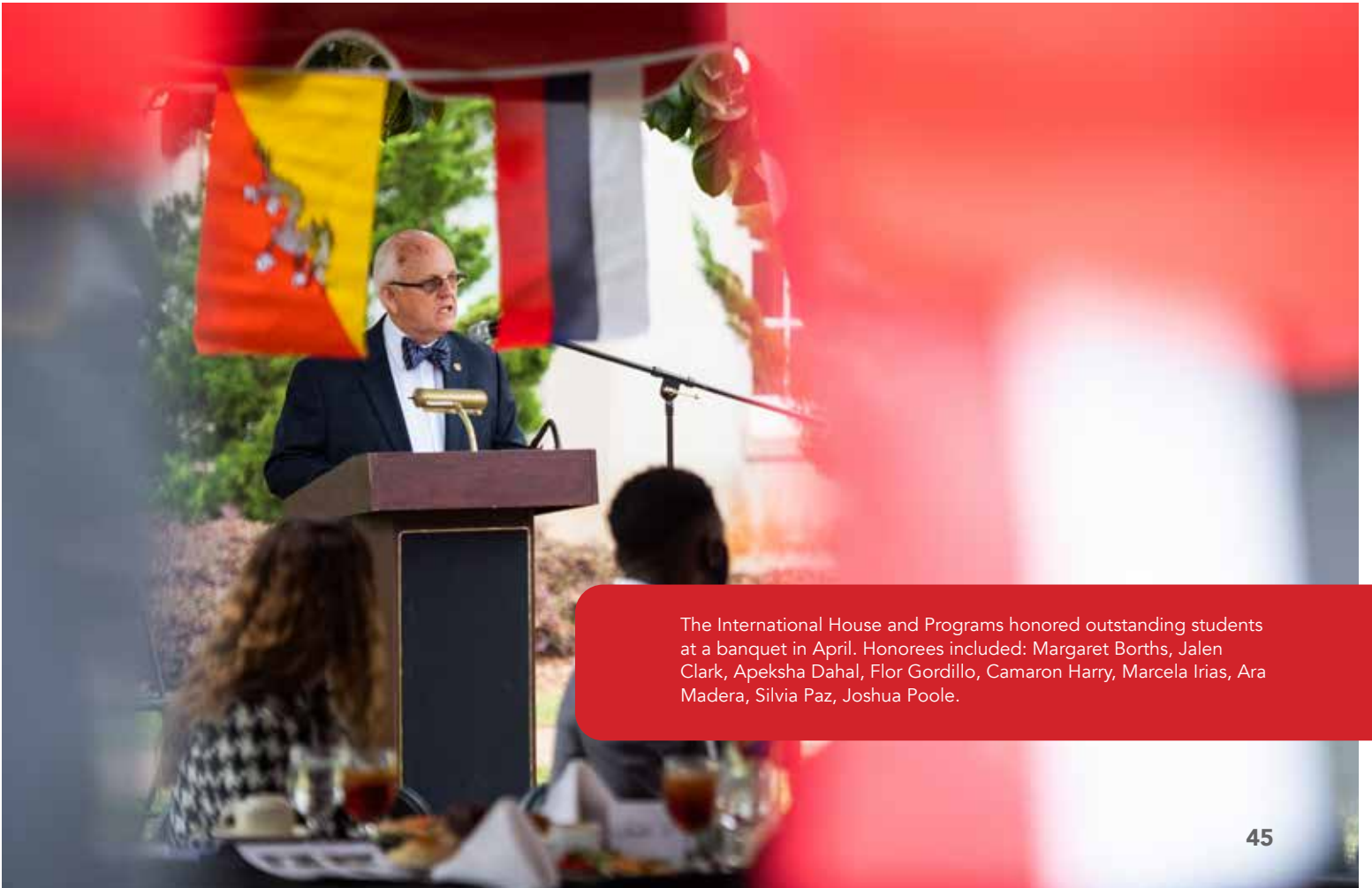

Enrollment Numbers

Enrollment Soars Despite Global Pandemic

In the face of COVID-19, when colleges and universities across the US were experiencing a decline in student enrollment, JSU posted its highest numbers since 2011.

Total student enrollment climbed to 9,238 in Fall 2020, up 217 students compared to Fall 2019 – an overall 2.4 percent increase. Credit hour production, which measures the hours of course credit students are registered in, was up 1.5 percent, rising above 104,000 for the first time since 2012. The university saw big

gains in the number of returning students, which increased by 418 students, or 7.6 percent.

“I am proud of how faculty and staff pulled together, during these difficult times, to help grow the JSU family,” said President Don Killingsworth. “I am also thankful to our students, who decided to begin or continue their studies on campus, despite the uncertain times we live in. As we saw in 2018, when enrollment remained steady in the face of a natural disaster, nothing can stop the Gamecock spirit.”

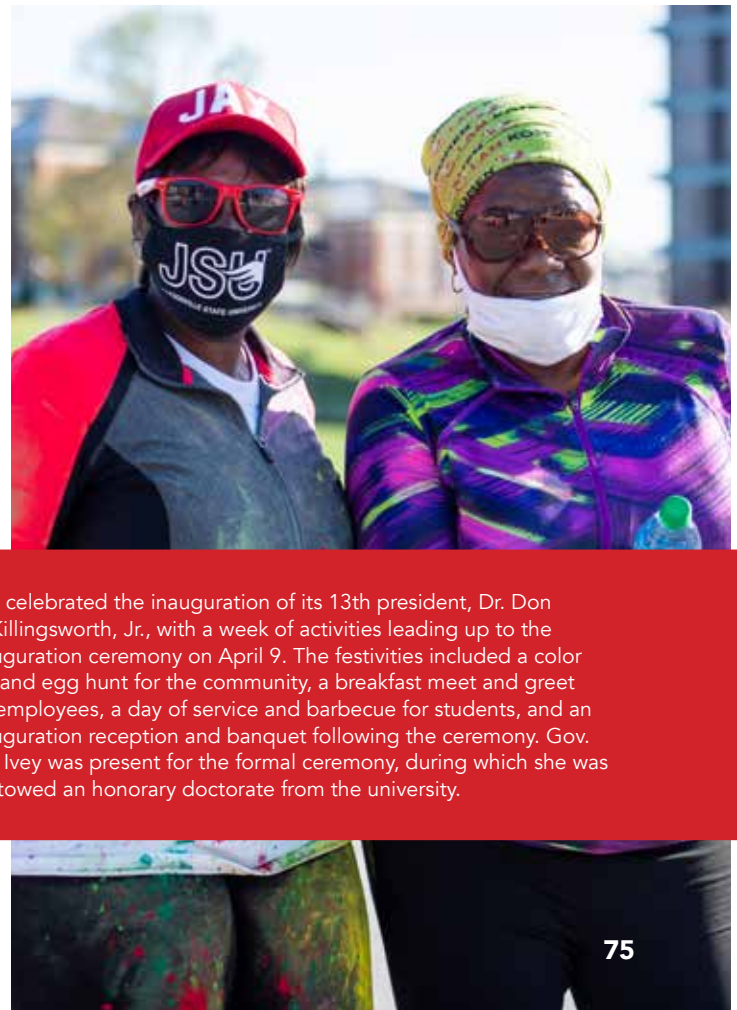

JSU celebrated the inauguration of its 13th president, Dr. Don C. Killingsworth, Jr., with a week of activities leading up to the inauguration ceremony on April 9. The festivities included a color run and egg hunt for the community, a breakfast meet and greet for employees, a day of service and barbecue for students, and an inauguration reception and banquet following the ceremony. Gov. Kay Ivey was present for the formal ceremony, during which she was bestowed an honorary doctorate from the university.















Stephenson Hall

81-Year-Old Stephenson Hall Renovated and Repurposed

One of JSU's historic buildings, 81-year-old Stephenson Hall, has been renovated and repurposed for the Department of Kinesiology and JSU Athletics.

Built in 1939 and originally christened "JW Stephenson Gym," the building was named in honor of Coach Julian W. Stephenson, who coached all sports offered on campus from 1919 to 1954. Stephenson Hall was initially home to the university's health and physical education programs, as well as the Gamecock basketball team. In recent decades, it served as the campus gym for students, faculty and staff until the new Recreation and Fitness Center opened in January 2019.

Now, the facility's former basketball court has been transformed into an Athletic Sports Performance Center for the university's 17 intercollegiate teams. The 12,000-square-foot space features a weight lifting area, wall-to-wall rubber flooring and a 35-yard artificial turf.

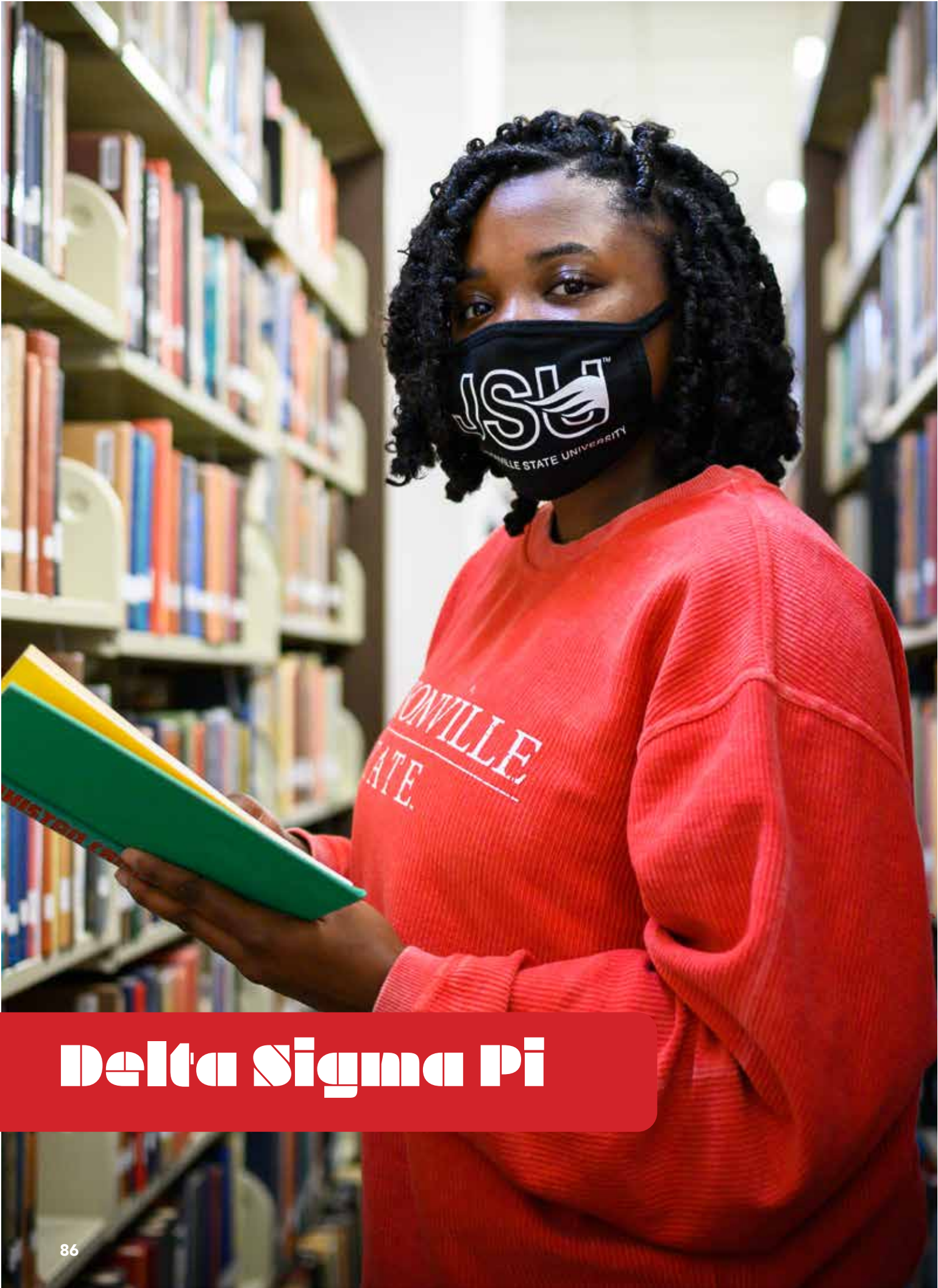
The former racquetball courts and fitness rooms have been converted into a Human Performance Lab, academic classrooms and activity space for the Department of Kinesiology. With the department's offices now located next door at Kenamer Hall – between Stephenson Hall and the Recreation and Fitness Center – its students, faculty and staff now have a centralized location to work, study and play.

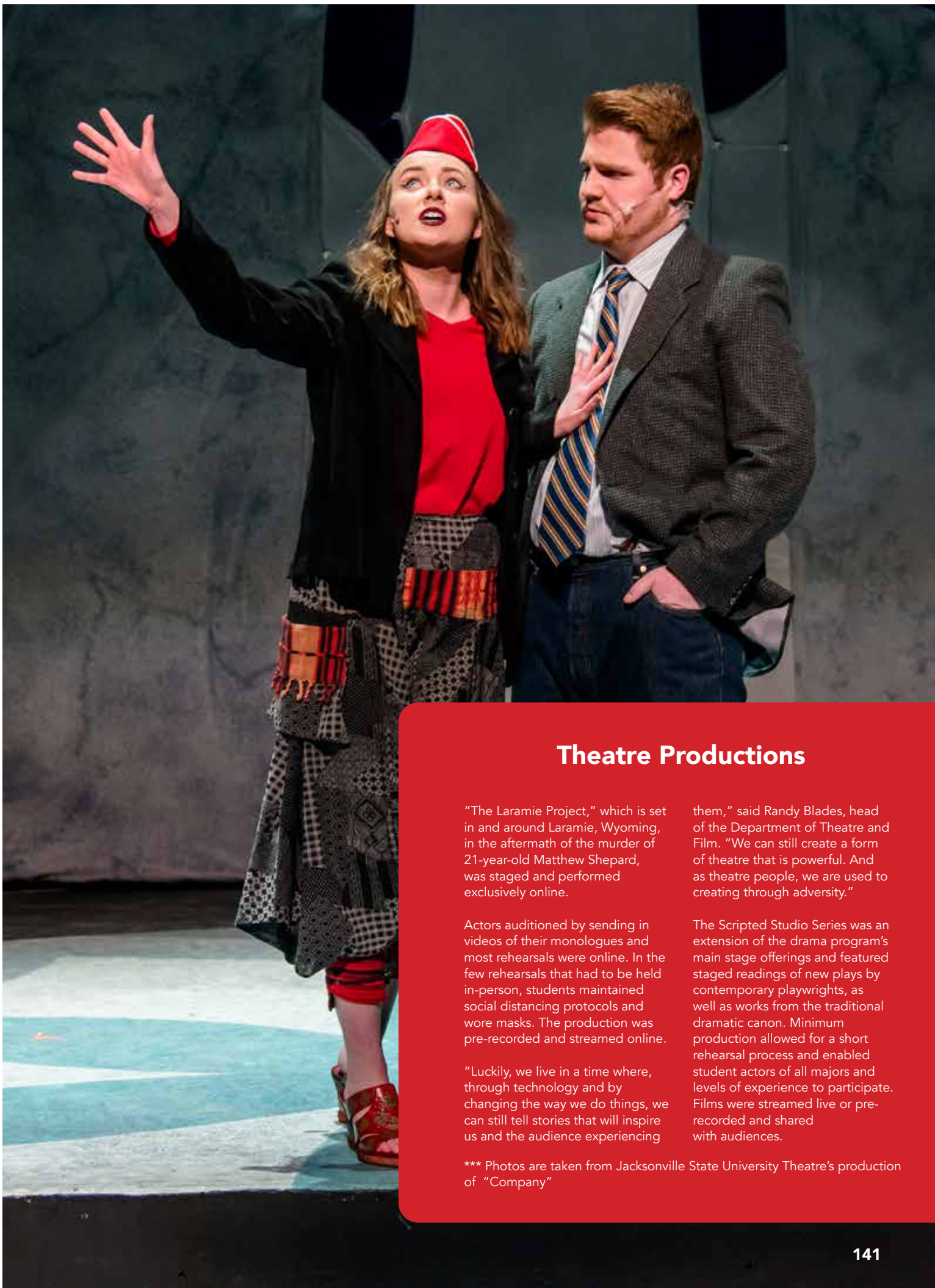


JSU Creatives Find Innovative Ways to Continue to Inspire

While the coronavirus remained a reality intruding on daily life throughout the 2020-2021 academic year, students, faculty and staff in JSU's College of Arts and Humanities found innovative ways to continue to share their talents.

"When people are isolated as they are due to this pandemic, the arts become even more important," said Dean Staci Stone.





Theatre Productions

"The Laramie Project," which is set in and around Laramie, Wyoming, in the aftermath of the murder of 21-year-old Matthew Shepard, was staged and performed exclusively online.

Actors auditioned by sending in videos of their monologues and most rehearsals were online. In the few rehearsals that had to be held in-person, students maintained social distancing protocols and wore masks. The production was pre-recorded and streamed online.

"Luckily, we live in a time where, through technology and by changing the way we do things, we can still tell stories that will inspire us and the audience experiencing

them," said Randy Blades, head of the Department of Theatre and Film. "We can still create a form of theatre that is powerful. And as theatre people, we are used to creating through adversity."

The Scripted Studio Series was an extension of the drama program's main stage offerings and featured staged readings of new plays by contemporary playwrights, as well as works from the traditional dramatic canon. Minimum production allowed for a short rehearsal process and enabled student actors of all majors and levels of experience to participate. Films were streamed live or pre-recorded and shared with audiences.

Jazz

Despite the challenges of COVID-19, the JSU Jazz program had an exciting year. Chris Fryar, drummer for the Zac Brown Band, served as artist-in-residence in the spring, visiting campus several times, leading master classes and performing with music faculty in an Alone Together virtual concert.

"I knew we needed to bring in a great guy and accomplished

musician to come help out our students in the crazy COVID time, so I asked him to participate and he said yes," said Dr. Andy Nevala, director of jazz studies, who met Fryar while performing together in the Chris Moore Project in Birmingham.

JSU Jazz also performed outdoors at local restaurant, Heirloom Taco, and hosted its 10th annual Jazz Festival virtually.





Literature Readings

Being forced to go virtual allowed the Department of English to broaden the selection of authors it hosted for campus readings each month. The department also launched a new program, "Writers, On Work," during which guest speakers discussed how they've used their English degrees in their profession.

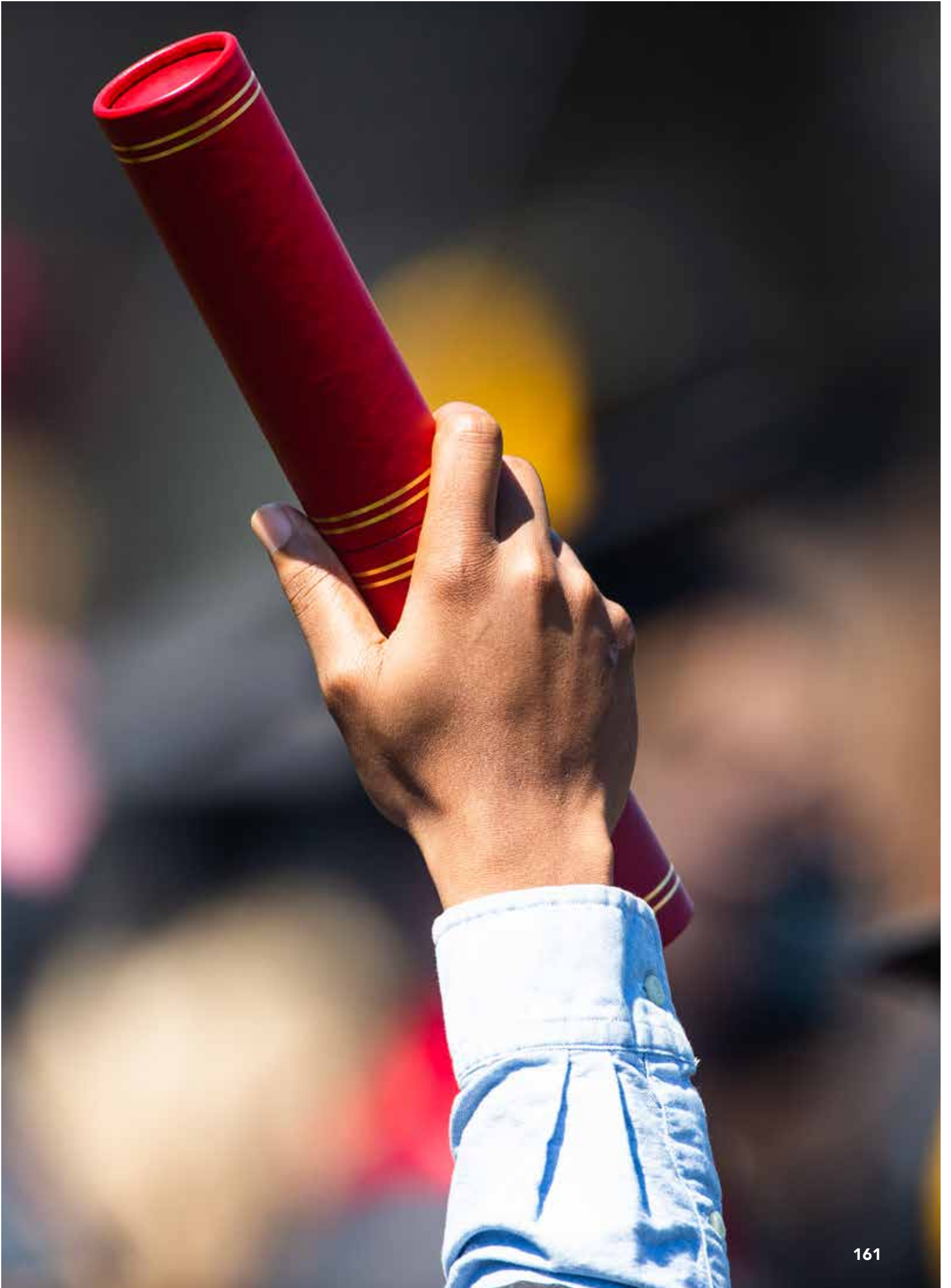


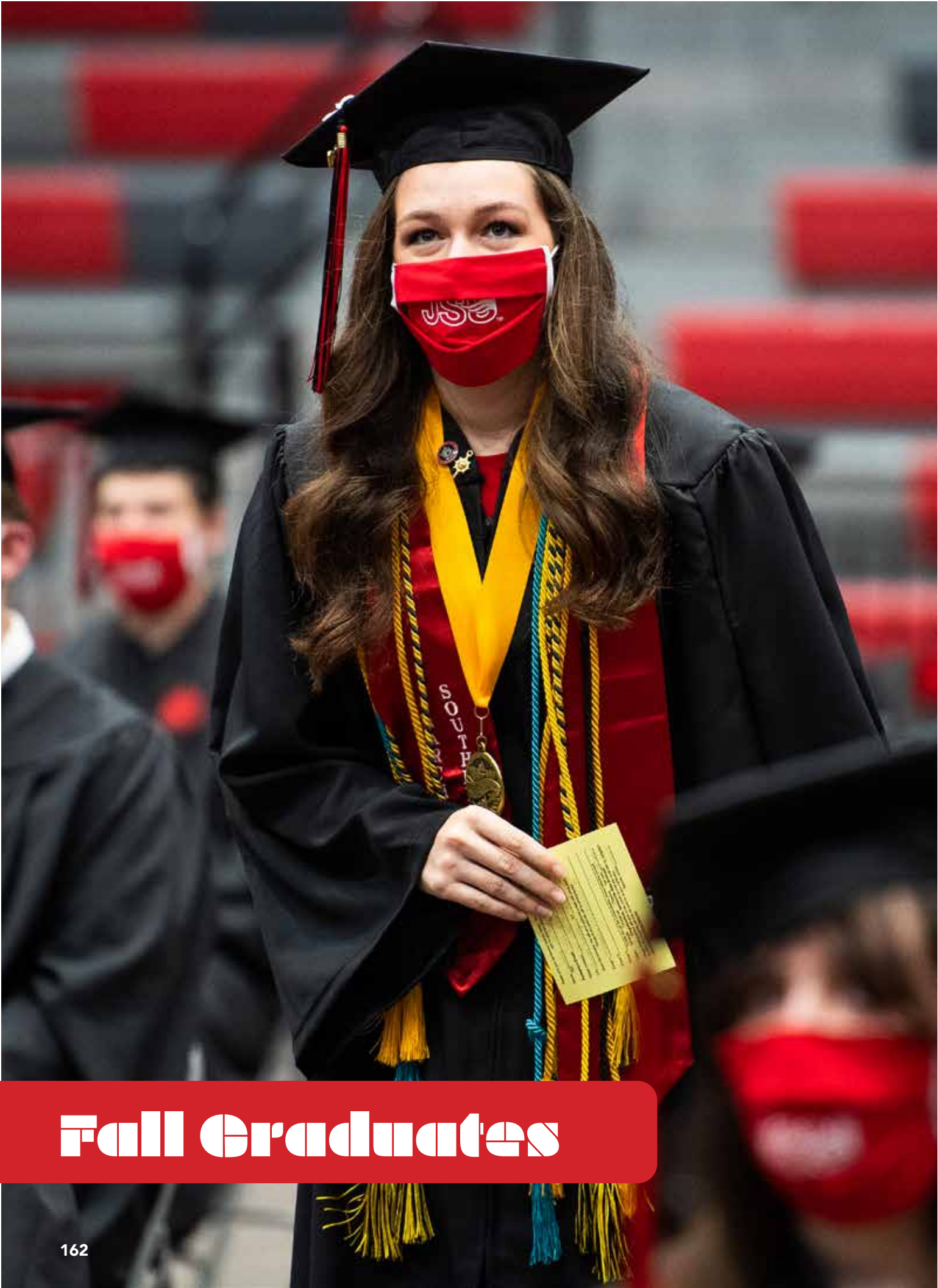

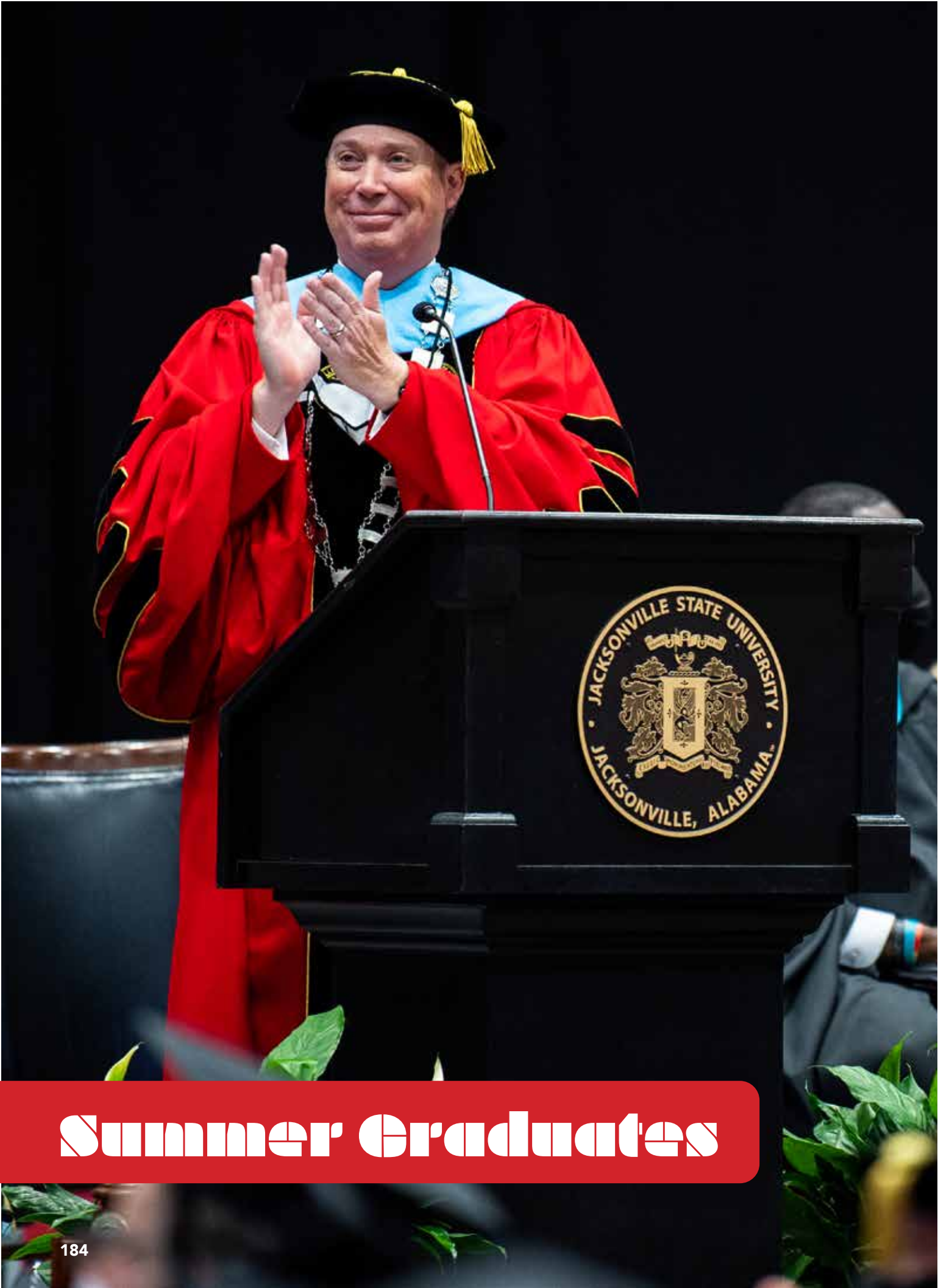
Identical Triplets Graduate From JSU
