AMERICAN COLLEGE THEATER FESTIVAL XXIII

Presented and produced by the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts

This production is a Participating entry in the American College Theater Festival (ACTF). The aims of this national educational theater program are to identify and promote quality in college-level theatre production. To this end, each production entered is eligible for adjudication by a regional American College Theater Festival representative. The production is also eligible for inclusion at the ACTF regional festival. Eight ACTF regional festivals are produced nationwide each year, and from these festivals up to six productions are selected to be part of the noncompetitive ACTF national festival at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts each spring. ACTF also sponsors regional and national level awards, scholarships, and special grants to student actors, playwrights, designers, and critics.

Last year more than 800 productions and 17,000 students participated in the American College Theater Festival nationwide. By entering this production in ACTF, our department is endorsing the ACTF goals to help college theater grow and to focus attention on the exemplary work produced in university and college theaters across the nation.



THE CENTER FOR SOUTHERN STUDIES is four years old. Its mission is to promote understanding of the South among academicians, public leaders, and the people of the region and the nation, to support research by Southern scholars, and to offer outreach programs to the people of Northeast Alabama. A part of Jacksonville State University, the Center for Southern Studies plays a major role in shaping a positive image for Alabama and this region.

The wood burnings featured in our lobby display were all produced by Dr. Donald J. Salls of Jacksonville. Dr. Salls, for whom the newly renovated Salls Hall was named, served as JSU's Head Football Coach from 1946 to 1964. During this period he became JSU's all-time winningest coach. Later, 1965-1981, he became a Professor of Education.

Dr. Salls became interested in woodburning shortly after his retirement in 1981 when he attended a craft convention in Gatlinburg, Tennessee. On display were some beautiful country scenes burned into wood. This sparked an interest and an effort to follow this craft.

Woodburning, known also as pyrography, can become a most enjoyable hobby. Once the scene is burned in wood it will not fade, run, or lose its dark and light contrast. Generally, the older the scene becomes, the more mellow it becomes.

The scenes represented in the lobby are mainly covered bridges located in Alabama and Georgia.
