
The show will run approximately 90 minutes. There will be no intermission.

#### **EXPRESSIONISM**

There is no doubt that contemporary theatre audiences are most familiar and accustomed to the style of Realism: a traditional style in theatre where all the details, stories, dialogue, and characteristics within a production attempt an accurate depiction of what happens in realistic storytelling. However, in *Machinal*, that is not the case. Instead, this play is written in a unique theatrical style called Expressionism.

Expressionism is not realism. Rather, it is a nonrealistic style, made popular in the early 20th Century, that exaggerates and distorts moments of reality to convey abstract individual feelings and concepts. Expressionistic stories portray the central protagonist's most inward thoughts or feelings rather than what realistically happens to them. Certain characters are nameless, and portrayed in a way that makes them seem unreal or inhuman, and the threatening world is shaped by vile, abstract representations of themes and concepts. Bits of dialogue are choppy and stylized and can seem robotic in some moments and haunting in others. The "music" is less of a flowing melody and more of a symbolic representation of the feelings being portrayed. The style was also popular in early silent films like The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari and Genuine: The Tragedy of a Vampire. Although Expressionism is quite different from the realism of today, it still influences contemporary genres like sci-fi, thrillers, and horror.

#### The true story behind Machinal

Machinal by Sophie Treadwell is an Expressionist play based on the murder trials of Ruth Snyder and Henry Judd Gray. In 1915, twenty-year-old Ruth Brown married 33-year-old Albert Snyder in New York City. Three years later, Ruth gave birth to their only child, Lorraine. In 1925, Ruth began an affair with Henry Judd Gray. He also had a daughter, Jane, who was around the same age as Lorraine. On March 20, 1927, Gray and Ruth killed Albert by brutally strangling, suffocating, and beating him to death. Gray then proceeded to tie Ruth's hands and feet together to stage the scene as a burglary and divert the attention away from the two. Lorraine, who was nine at the time, awakened that morning to her mother crawling to her door and knocking on it, insisting that her husband had been killed in the night by burglars.


Ruth and Gray were accused of murdering Albert and stood trial together, though Ruth requested and was denied a separate trial. They blamed each other; Ruth saying she had tried to stop Gray, and Gray claiming he was intoxicated and influenced to commit the crime. They were both found guilty and sentenced to death by electrocution. While Ruth resided in Sing-Sing prison in New York, Ruth's mother cared for Lorriane. She would later be awarded full guardianship of the child. Before their deaths, Gary wrote eleven letters to his daughter, Jane, one for each of her birthdays until she turned 21. Ruth wrote only two letters: one to Lorraine, and one to her mother, with instructions not to give her daughter the letter until she was "old enough to understand". Per her mother's request, Lorraine did not see Ruth before she was executed.

Ruth was executed on January 12, 1928, and became only the 4th woman to be executed in the state of New York, the 3rd woman to be executed via electric chair in New York, the 2nd woman in Sing-Sing to be executed, and the 1st person to ever have their picture taken while being executed. A reporter famously snuck a camera into the execution room and snapped a photo while the electricity was running through Ruth's body. Gray was executed 10

minutes later. The covert photo of Snyder's execution has been described as "the most remarkable exclusive picture in the history of criminology."

Sophie Treadwell was hired for her first job as a journalist in 1908, where she had the opportunity to interview celebrities and cover murder trials, and when Ruth Snyder's trial made headlines in 1927, Treadwell was assigned to follow it. Soon after, she wrote Machinal, and it premiered on Broadway on September 7, 1928. While its first production only ran for one month, it has remained a very popular piece through the years, heavily anthologized in dramatic collections and taught and studied all over the world. It was revived on Broadway in 2014 and was nominated for four Tony Awards. While nearly 100 years old, Machinal echoes our contemporary moment; in the face of increasing technology that threatens to numb us beyond authentic connection, its thundering questions could not be more relevant.


ALLISON WOODWARD (Choreographer) is an award-winning dancer, choreographer and teacher who has been on
